In response to the high incidence of community spread of the COVID-19 virus, the Kodiak Emergency Services Council is implementing the following:

### **Kodiak Island Borough Businesses and Activities Restrictions**

*Phase 5 of the Kodiak Emergency Operations Center Pandemic Influenza Plan:  
Limited capacity to essential and non-essential business.*

Effective 8:00 a.m. December 7, 2020 through December 21, 2020

All Kodiak Island Businesses and Activities, including all retail and service types, indoor recreational activities, bars, restaurants, religious gatherings, grocery and any business or service that is open to the public is now restricted to 25% customer capacity. This capacity is calculated from the business fire marshal occupancy load.

Each business and facility is encouraged to use COVID-19 mitigation measures and whenever reasonable to use online shopping, appointment shopping, curbside service (takeout orders). Indoor dining and bars may remain open; however strict social distancing is required. The 11-19-2020 Kodiak mask mandate remains in effect.

Exceptions to the capacity restriction include medical facilities, travel for critical personal need or essential service, child care services, homeless shelters, educational institutions, government agencies and critical infrastructure services such as public utility services. Seafood processors shall operate under the state required mandates.
